Remote Learning Wednesdays to continue at FMS, FHS

RAS students will attend in-person classes

The Fayetteville City School System has announced that Remote Learning Wednesdays will continue after the Thanksgiving break through the end of the semester at Fayetteville Middle School and Fayetteville High School.

Ralph Askins School students, however, will continue to have in-person classes on those Wednesdays.

Virtual Wednesdays at the elementary school have allowed traditional teachers and students the opportunity to explore virtual learning from home in the event that the school system went completely virtual. Since the elementary school has a Virtual Academy which offers a different framework for learning than that of the middle and high schools, FCS has found that continuing the Virtual Wednesdays is not needed at this time at Ralph Askins School.

The Fayetteville City School System appreciates the support of parents during this time of uncertainty and feels confident that in the event the system did go completely virtual, students and staff will be adequately prepared to continue a successful educational experience.
