Principals' Reports – All principals submitted a written report of activities at their schools.

Dr. Jones – reported that Askins had a great sorting day and College App week. CASE Assessments will be done after fall break and in February. Core office is supporting us in RTI and Math. Enrollment – Pre-K, 80, K – 104, First Grade – 107, Second Grade – 93, Third Grade – 111, Fourth Grade – 102, SPED not listed in regular homeroom – 4 for a total of 601.

Mr. Giffin – said that it has been great having Scottie Vaughn at the school and looks forward to him being there every day. FMS Students were chosen for Students of the Month – Friendliest and Cooperative. Junior's House did a lesson on "Body Safety" with fifth grade students. Sports are all going well. Enrollment – Fifth Grade – 128, Sixth Grade – 131, Seventh Grade – 105 and Eighth Grade 116 for a total of 480.

Mr. Jones – reported how proud he was of the three students who scored 30 or higher on the ACT. There was a breach in the ACT Test so ACT is cancelling their fall retake test. Enrollment: Ninth Grade – 91, Tenth Grade – 84, Eleventh Grade – 90, Twelfth Grade – 82 for a total of 348.

Director's Report

Dr. Wilson – presented the Fall Blast Fundraiser request for November 9 from 3:30-6:30 at Askins. Mrs. Palacio made a motion to approve the Fall Blast request; second by Mr. Clark. All board members present voted aye.
