Reports:

Facilities and Transportation – Mr. Beddingfield reported on the new phone system. ENA will install the new phone system replacing an older AT&T system.

Mrs. Dotson – reported there is a CTE Monitoring being conducted this year. This is an evaluation of CTE programs and making sure standards are being followed as set out by the program.

Mrs. Young – reported on Mr. Doug Eaton's professional development training with teachers. He has been spending time with individual staff members to improve classroom instruction using technology.

Mrs. Tuten – reported there will be an on-site monitoring October 17 and 18 on all federal programs. They will visit both Askins and FMS. They will monitor all federal programs making sure we are following all guidelines. She is looking forward to learning more about federal programs through this process since she is still relatively new in this position.

Principals' Reports – All principals submitted a written report of activities at their schools.

Bridgette Jones – presented pictures of activities at Askins, and Dr. Jones thanked Dr. Styles for helping with all of these activities. Askins is having an attendance challenge for all grades having a prize at the end. There will be a flu shot clinic, book fair week, state monitoring visit and a family reading night and book fair. Enrollment is PK – 80, Kindergarten – 100, First Grade – 105, Second Grade – 92, Third Grade – 93, Fourth Grade – 107, Spec Ed (not listed in regular homeroom) 15 for a total of 592.

Steve Giffin – reported on Commissioner Penny Schwinn's visit. Football Homecoming was a great success; Beta Club won and qualified in the Rapid Response and Lead Outside the Box Competitions. Vincent Ruhlander was selected to be a leadership representative. He was one of three students in the state. The national competition is in Houston, TX this year. FMS had a good football, soccer and volleyball season. Enrollment is Fifth Grade – 106, Sixth Grade – 124, Seventh Grade – 124, Eighth Grade – 101 with a total of 455.

Adam McCormick – Homecoming went well Friday night. FAFSA Frenzy and College App Weeks were a huge success. ACT Senior Retake was today and ACT Boot Camp will be during fall break for any student who would like extra test prep. The FHS Cafeteria staff earned a perfect 100 score for the fifth year in a row. Student Council is planning to participate in the Red Sand Project to raise awareness to combat human trafficking. Football is off to a great start 6-0 with a Region Championship game this Friday against Cornersville. Volleyball placed second in Silver Division at Rocket City Blast Tournament and start their District Tournament on October 7. Enrollment is Ninth Grade – 112, Tenth Grade – 87, Eleventh Grade – 88, Twelfth Grade – 91 with a total of 378.
